PATRIOTIC EXERCISES

Instructional Programs & Materials



Purpose/Background

Rocky View Schools believes that patriotic exercises such as singing of the national anthem and observing Remembrance Day foster pride in Canadian citizenship.

Procedures

- 1. The Principal is responsible for the design of the patriotic exercises held at the school and approves all matters included in the exercises.
 - 1.1 Patriotic exercises shall not include the recitation of any religious prayer.
 - 1.2 Patriotic exercises may include a "quiet time".
 - 1.3 A statement advising parents of the practice and the general format of school patriotic exercises is to be included in the School Handbook.
- 2. Remembrance Day is to be acknowledged and honoured as outlined below:
 - 2.1 Each Principal shall ensure a Remembrance Day Ceremony is conducted. All students shall either attend the ceremony or remain in the school elsewhere.
 - 2.2 Remembrance Day observance will occur on the school day immediately preceding Remembrance Day. At least two (2) minutes of silence from 11:00 a.m. to 11:02 a.m. will be observed in a Remembrance Day ceremony or by another appropriate means.
- 3. Parents may request to have their child(ren) opt out of patriotic exercises for cultural and/or religious beliefs.
 - 3.1 Students are to be allowed to leave the classroom or to remain silent in the classroom during the patriotic exercise.
 - 3.2 Students are expected to display appropriate behaviour in their alternative activities.
